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
# **Declamation Contest**

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

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
# Gandhi Jayanthi

Online Quiz competition on the Life of Gandhi and contribution to the nation - occasion of Gandhi Javanthi - 02-10-2021








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# Mahathma Gandhi Biography and his Contributions towards Independence


Event: Gandhi Javanthi

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

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# **Independence Day**


### **Event: Independence Day**

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### THE INTERNATIONAL DAY AGAINST DRUG ABUSE AND ILLICIT TRAFFICKING

Event: Sensitization session against drug abuse and illicit trafficking on World Drug Day

Date: 26th June, 2021

Andhra Loyola Institute of Engineering and Technology management conducted sensitization session against drug abuse and illicit trafficking on 26<sup>th</sup> June, 2021 to mechanical students. I. Hussain, Inspector & Sri M. Sattibabu, Additional of Police, Special Enforcement Bureau, Vijayawada, East station were invited as resource persons to explain about drug and alcohol abuse and problems that affect College-age youth at earlier ages than in the past. They explained that young people frequently begin to experiment with alcohol, tobacco, and other drugs by the time students are in high school, rates of substance use are remarkably high. They said that traditionally counseling in traditional days was only focused on drug and alcohol abuse education. It involved the dissemination of information on drug abuse and the negative health, social, and legal consequences of abuse. They added contemporary approaches include social resistance and competence-enhancement programs, which focus less on didactic instruction and more on interactive-skills training techniques. Rev. Fr. A. Francis Xavier S.J, Director, Principal Dr. O. Mahesh, Principla also delivered valuable information to students. The program was coordinated by Dr. V. V. Prabhakar Rao and Supported by Dr. M Geetha Rani, HoD & Mr.K Teja Swarup, Assistant Professor of Mechanical Engineering Department.


